



Dr. Karin Hollerbach is the CEO of Taku Group, an advisory and interim management firm based in Silicon Valley. She is also a Member of the Management Board of Sutter global, a European-US joint venture in clean tech. Previously Dr. Hollerbach has served as CEO, Executive VP, VP of Technology, and VP of Products.
