



Dr. Norine E. Noonan is Professor of Biology at the University of South Florida St. Petersburg (USFSP) and Director of the USFSP Advanced Placement Summer Institute (endorsed by the College Board). From 2008 to 2013, she served as Vice Chancellor for Academic and Student Affairs at USFSP. In this role, she was the Chief Academic Officer of the institution (over 6,000 students). She was responsible for three academic Colleges, the Nelson Poynter Memorial Library, and the Offices of Campus Computing, Academic Advising, Institutional Research, Effectiveness and Student Success, and Registrar. She also oversaw all Student Affairs areas including Financial Aid, Student Life, Residential Life and Housing, Student Judicial Affairs, and Counseling and Wellness. She previously served as the Dean of the School of Sciences and Mathematics at the College of Charleston from 2002 to 2008.

From 1998 to 2001, Dr. Noonan served as the Assistant Administrator for Research and Development at the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. She was appointed by President Clinton and confirmed by the United States Senate. As Assistant Administrator, Dr. Noonan was responsible for a budget of nearly \$600 million and 2,000 people in 14 locations across the U.S., including offices at EPA headquarters in Washington, DC.

Prior to coming to EPA, Dr. Noonan was Vice President for Research and Dean of the Graduate School at the Florida Institute of Technology in Melbourne, Florida. In this capacity, she had institutional responsibility for all research grants and contracts, Federal compliance issues, and technology transfer, as well as oversight of graduate admissions and all graduate programs.

Prior to joining Florida Tech, Dr. Noonan was Chief of the Science and Space Programs Branch, Energy and Science Division, at the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) in Washington, DC. She was responsible for over \$20 billion including the National Science Foundation, National Aeronautics and Space Administration, Smithsonian Institution, Office of Science and Technology Policy, and National Gallery of Art. She prepared all budget materials on research and development for the President of the United States and his senior advisors, and had a prominent role in developing and implementing civil space policy. She served as the lead OMB staff member for monitoring and evaluating all federal research and development, including STEM education.

Dr. Noonan is a member and Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS). She was inducted into four national honor societies: Phi Beta Kappa, Sigma Xi, Phi Kappa Phi, and Omicron Delta Kappa (leadership honor society). Her professional activities have included membership on six NSF Advisory Committees, two of which she chaired, and a number of study committees of the National Research Council. She has also served as an expert reviewer for EPSCoR and INBRE programs in two states. In October of 2005, she received the NASA Public Service Medal, the highest civilian honor the agency can bestow.

Dr. Noonan received her B.A. in zoology from the University of Vermont, summa cum laude, and her M.A. and Ph.D. degrees in cell biology from Princeton University.
